



CCS RECONVENING WORKSHEET

The CCS typically reconvenes after election day to process provisional, corrective-action, and late-arriving mail ballots before the final results of the election are canvassed. Because statutory deadlines vary, fill in the appropriate date in the right-hand box of this worksheet.

	Late-Arriving ABBM Ballots	- Ballots from voters in the United States who submitted an ABBM. - Must be postmarked by 7 p.m. on election day and received by early voting clerk by 5 p.m. on first business day after election day.	Date One Day After the Election:
	Late-Arriving Overseas ABBM and FPCA Ballots	- Ballots from outside the United States by voters who submitted an ABBM or non-military overseas voters who submitted an FPCA. - Must be received by early voting clerk no later than five days after election day.	Date Five Days After the Election:
	Late-Arriving FPCA Ballots	- Ballots from voters who submitted an FPCA and indicated that they are in the military. - Must be received by early voting clerk no later than six days after election day.	Date Six Days After the Election:
	Ballots by Mail in Corrective Action Process	- Only applicable if there is a curable defect on the voter's carrier envelope for a ballot by mail. - The voter must correct the defect with early voting clerk no later than six days after election day.	Date Six Days After the Election:
	Provisional Ballots	- The voter registrar must complete their review of provisional ballots within nine days after election day (or ten days after election day for a general election for state and county officers). - Following this review, the EVBB meets to qualify the ballots and delivers those accepted to the CCS for tabulation.	Date Nine or Ten Days After the Election:
