# **Voter Registration Eligibility**

**Texas Election Code (TEC) § 11.002** 

- Applicant must:
- be a United States Citizen;
- be at least 17 years and 10 months old;
- be a resident of Texas;
- not have been finally convicted of a felony; and if so, have completed their term of incarceration, parole, or supervision, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court
- not have been declared totally or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote by a court of law.





#### Determination of Eligibility TEC § 20.006

- An employee of a voter registration agency **may not** make any determination about a person's eligibility for registration other than whether or not a person is of voting age or a U.S. Citizen.
- A person's age and citizenship status may be determined **only if** such information is filed with the agency for purposes other than voting.
- A person must be offered voter registration assistance **even if** the applicant's age and/or citizenship status cannot be determined.





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#### Section 1 –

- The applicant **must**:
  - 1. Indicate whether this is a new application, a change of address, name or other information, or a request for a replacement card;
  - 2. Declare their citizenship status; and
  - 3. Declare whether he or she will be 18 years old on or before election day
- Only if the applicant indicated **affirmatively** to **both questions** should he/she continue completing the application.
- The applicant **may** select whether he or she is interested in serving as an election worker. This is optional.





Section 2 – Name.

- The applicant **must** provide:
  - A last name;
  - First name;
  - Middle name, *if any*; and
  - Former name (*Previous/Maiden name*).

#### Section 3 - Residence address.

• If the applicant does not have a street address, he/she must provide a concise description of the location where he/she resides for the assignment of a voting precinct by the voter registrar. *(Ex: The corner of 10<sup>th</sup> and Brazos)* 





#### Section 4 – Alternate mailing address.

• If the applicant receives mail at an address other than the residence address, he/she can provide it here.

#### Section 5 – Former residence.

• City and county of former residence in Texas, if applicable.

#### Section 6 - Date of Birth.

• Date of birth must include the month, day and year of birth.







#### Section 8 – Telephone Number. (optional)

Section 9 –

- The applicant must include:
  - Driver's License number; or
  - Personal Identification number issued by the TX DPS; or
  - Last 4 digits of applicant's social security number.
  - Note: If the applicant does not have a Texas issued Driver's License or Personal Identification number, he or she will need to check the box indicating that fact.

**Section 10** – Acknowledgement and Signature. *(Signature must be original and cannot be electronic)* 



# **Review of Application**

- Agency employees may review applications for completeness only in the applicant's presence. If the agency employee determines that the application **does not contain all the required information and the required signature**, the agency staff may return to the applicant for completion and resubmission. (TEC § 20.032)
- If a question arises concerning voter registration that the agency employee cannot answer, the employee **must** provide:
  - The toll-free number for Elections Division at the Office of the Secretary of State (800-252-8683).
  - The telephone number of the voter registrar to whom registration applications are submitted within the county. (TEC § 20.008)



#### **Declination of Registration** TEC § 20.036

- If an applicant declines the voter registration application, a declination of registration form should be **completed and signed** by the applicant.
- If the applicant refuses to sign the declination form, the agency employee must include a notation of that fact on the form.
- Declination forms must be preserved for at least 22 months after the date of signing either in the applicant's file at the agency or in a separate declination file.
- Declinations **are confidential** and may be used only for voter registration purposes.





## **Submission of Application** EFFECTIVE DATE OF REGISTRATION



# **Effective Date of Registration**

- The date of submission of a completed voter registration application to an agency employee is considered the date of submission to the county voter registrar for the purpose of determining the effective date of registration only (TEC §20.033).
- The voter registration will become effective thirty (30) days after it is received or on the voter's 18th birthday, whichever is later.
- Information regarding the agency or office to which an application is submitted is confidential and may be used only for voter registration purposes. (TEC § 20.032(d))





#### **Prohibited Acts** WHAT NOT TO DO



#### Prohibited Acts TEC § 20.007

An employee of a voter registration agency **may not**:

- influence an applicant;
- display political party materials;
- seek to influence an applicant's party preference;
- discourage or mislead an applicant in any way; or
- imply that registering to vote has any effect on the patron receiving agency services.





## Application Delivery WHO, WHAT, WHEN & WHERE





#### Collection & Delivery TEC § 20.035(b)

Once collected by agency personnel, the agency **must**:

- deliver in person all completed registration applications submitted to agency employees to the voter registrar of the county in which the agency office is located; and
- deliver to the appropriate state election official no later than the 5th day after the application is submitted to an agency employee.
