Ethics Advisory Opinions

Whether communications and appearances while representing an intervening party during judicial review of an agency order constitute prohibited communications to or appearances before the agency's officers or employees by a former member of the governing body of the agency. (AOR-751.)

Whether the TEC may impose a civil penalty pursuant to Section 572.033 of the Government Code for a late personal financial statement (PFS) if the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) did not send the filer a notice to file as required by Section 572.030 of the Government Code. (AOR-752.)

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Whether the requestor's legislative training materials require a legislative advertising disclosure statement.

Whether the requestor's planned business activities require her register as a lobbyist. (AOR-753.)

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Whether contributions given to fund an individual voter's legal expenses are political contributions requiring reporting by either the individual or the specific purpose committee that the individual remains an active campaign treasurer for. Whether the requestor has any Title 15 campaign-finance obligations for the contributions received and spent for their individual election contest litigation. (AOR-754.)

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
