Correction of Error

The Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services proposed the repeal of 40 TAC §§101.401, 101.403, 101.405, 101.407, and 101.409 in the September 4, 2026, issue of the *Texas Register* (51 TexReg 6158). Due to an error by the Texas Register, text was omitted from the first paragraph in the BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE information in the preamble of the proposed repeal.

The first paragraph of the BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE section should read as follows:

The State Independent Living Council (SILC) was created as a result of the Rehabilitation Act (Act) in Title 29 United States Code Section 796d. The Act requires Texas to maintain a SILC. Rules for the SILC were originally adopted in 1993 in accordance with Senate Bill 383, 73rd Legislature, Regular Session, which required state agencies to outline in rule the committees and councils which advise the state.

Texas Health and Safety Code and Texas Water Code Settlement Notice

The State of Texas gives notice of the following proposed resolution of an environmental enforcement action under the Texas Health and Safety Code and the Texas Water Code. Before the State may enter into a voluntary settlement agreement, pursuant to section 7.110 of the Texas Water Code, the State shall permit the public to comment in writing. The Attorney General will consider any written comments and may withdraw or withhold consent to the proposed agreement if the comments disclose facts or considerations indicating that consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the law.

Case Title and Court: *State of Texas v. Ascend Performance Materials Texas Inc., Ascend Performance Materials Inc., and Ascend Performance Material Operations, LLC*; Cause No. D-1-GN-25-009181; in the 353rd District Court of Travis County, Texas.

Background: Ascend Performance Materials Texas Inc., Ascend Performance Materials Inc., and Ascend Performance Material Operations, LLC ("Defendants") operate a business as an industrial organic chemical manufacturing facility. Defendants filed Chapter 11 Bankruptcy for Reorganization of Ascend Performance Materials Holdings Inc. and Its Debtor Affiliate. The State of Texas (the "State") filed its Original Petition for violations of the Texas Clean Air Act, the Texas Water Code, and the Texas Health and Safety Code. The State documented environmental violations, consisting of eight unauthorized wastewater discharges, failure to provide wastewater records, three emissions exceedances, failures to conduct annual and initial monitoring, failure to report deviations, and failure to conduct monitoring in multiple units operated under its permits. The State, its bankruptcy division, and the Defendants have reached a settlement

agreement to distribute pursuant to Defendants Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Plan.

Proposed Settlement: The State and Defendants propose an Agreed Final Judgment that awards the State the following monetary judgments against the Defendants: \$700,000.00 in civil penalties and \$15,000.00 in attorney's fees to the State.

Texas Water Code and Texas Health and Safety Code Settlement Notice

Notice is hereby given by the State of Texas of the following proposed resolution of an environmental enforcement action under the Texas Water Code and the Texas Health and Safety Code. Before the State may enter into a voluntary settlement agreement, pursuant to section 7.110 of the Texas Water Code, the State shall permit the public to comment in writing on the proposed judgment. The Attorney General will consider any written comments and may withdraw or withhold consent to the proposed agreed judgment if the comments disclose facts or considerations that indicate that the consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the Texas Water Code.

Case Title and Court: *Harris County, Texas, and the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, a Necessary and Indispensable Party v. TransCo Ready Mix, LLC*; Cause No. 2025-87852, in the 269th Judicial District, Harris County, Texas.

Nature of the Suit: TransCo Ready Mix, LLC owns and operates a concrete batch plant located at 5325 Barker Cypress Road, Houston, Texas 77084 (the "Facility"). The Facility operates under the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ") Concrete Batch Plant Standard Permit and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("TPDES") General Permit. Over the course of four investigations conducted from May 23, 2024 to October 3, 2025, Harris County Pollution Control Services Department investigators documented violations of the Texas Clean Air Act, the Texas Water Code, and rules promulgated by the TCEQ including: failure to control the dust emissions and maintain adequate dust control efficiency; failure to produce Discharge Monitoring Reports and analytical results; failure to maintain and produce monitoring records for on-site review; and failure to comply with

the TPDES Permit. The State of Texas, on behalf of TCEQ, joined the suit as a necessary and indispensable party.

Proposed Settlement: The proposed Agreed Final Judgment assesses against the Defendant civil penalties in the amount of \$45,000.00 in civil penalties and \$5,000.00 in attorney's fees, with each amount to be split evenly between Harris County and the State. Since the Site has ceased operations, there is no continuing conduct to enjoin; therefore, injunctive relief is not required.

Agreed Orders

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ, agency, or commission) staff is providing an opportunity for written public comment on the listed Agreed Orders (AOs) in accordance with Texas Water Code (TWC), §7.075. TWC, §7.075 requires that before the commission may approve the AOs, the commission shall allow the public an opportunity to submit written comments on the proposed AOs. TWC, §7.075 requires that notice of the proposed orders and the opportunity to comment must be published in the *Texas Register* no later than the 30th day before the date on which the public comment period closes, which in this case is **October 19, 2026**. TWC, §7.075 also requires that the commission promptly consider any written comments received and that the commission may withdraw or withhold approval of an AO if a comment discloses facts or considerations that indicate that consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or incon-

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. Formosa Plastics Corporation, Texas and Formosa Utility Venture, Ltd., P.O. Box 700, Point Comfort, Texas 77978, which operates the Formosa Point Comfort Plant, a plastics and organic and inorganic chemicals manufacturing facility has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal of Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0002436000 which authorizes the discharge of remediated groundwater, fire water, and treated previously monitored effluents (via Outfalls 101 and 201) at a daily average flow not to exceed 9,700,000 gallons per day via Outfall 001; treated process wastewater, equipment/facility washdown, stormwater, firewater, and utility wastewaters (including pretreated sanitary wastewaters) at a daily average flow not to exceed 4,400,000 gallons per day via internal Outfall 101; treated and combined Ion Exchange Membrane (IEM) wastewater streams, utility wastewaters (including pretreated sanitary wastewaters), equipment/facility washdown, stormwater, fire water, and water treatment wastewaters on a continuous and flow-variable basis via internal Outfall 201; cooling tower blowdown on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfall 901; non-process area stormwater, hydrostatic test water, fire water, non-contact steam condensate, non-contact wash water, potable water, and air conditioner unit condensate on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfalls 002, 003, 004, 005, 006, 007, 008, 009, 010, 011, and 012; and non-process area stormwater, hydrostatic test water, fire water, non-contact steam condensate, non-contact wash water, potable water, air conditioner unit

condensate, and ash truck wash water condensate on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfall 013.

The draft permit authorizes the discharge of remediated groundwater, fire water, and treated previously monitored effluents (via Outfalls 101 and 201) at a daily average flow not to exceed 9,700,000 gallons per day via Outfall 001; treated process wastewater, equipment/facility washdown, stormwater, fire water, and utility wastewaters (including pretreated sanitary wastewaters) at a daily average flow not to exceed 6,000,000 gallons per day via Outfall 101; treated and combined Ion Exchange Membrane (IEM) wastewater streams, utility wastewaters (including pretreated sanitary wastewaters), equipment/facility washdown, stormwater, fire water, and water treatment wastes on a continuous and flow-variable basis via Outfall 201; cooling tower blowdown, cooling water filter backwash, and non-process area stormwater on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfall 901 (to the ALCOA mud pits for dust suppression); non-process area stormwater, hydrostatic test water, fire water, non-contact condensate, non-contact wash water, potable water, and air conditioner unit condensate on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfalls 003, 005, 006, 009, 010, 011, 012, and 013. The TCEQ received this application on July 8, 2019.

PURPOSE OF COMBINED NOTICE: This combined notice is being issued because the original NORI listed the permit action as a major amendment. The applicant has withdrawn the major amendment request to authorize the discharge of stormwater on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via new Outfall 014. Based on the withdrawal of the lone major amendment request, and the remaining amendment requests are classified as minor amendments, the application is reclassified as a renewal application. Additionally, the previously combined NORI-NAPD stated the public viewing location of the permit application, Executive Director's Preliminary Decision, and Draft Permit in Calhoun County as Point Comfort Public Library, Lamar Street, Point Comfort, in Calhoun County, Texas. The correct public viewing location in Calhoun County is Port Lavaca Public Library, 200 W Mahan Street, Port Lavaca, in Calhoun County, Texas.

The facility is located at 201 Formosa Drive, one-mile north of the intersection of State Highway 35 and Farm-to-Market Road 1593, northeast of the City of Point Comfort, in Calhoun County, Texas 77978. This link to an electronic map of the site or facility's general location is provided as a public courtesy and is not part of the application or notice. The effluent is discharged via Outfall 001 directly to Lavaca Bay/Chocolate Bay in Segment No. 2453; via Outfalls 003 and 012 to unnamed ditches, thence to Cox Lake, thence to Cox Creek, thence to Huisache Cove; via Outfalls 005, 006, and 009 to Cox Lake, thence to Cox Creek, thence to Huisache Cove; via Outfall 010 to unnamed ditches, thence to Cox Lake, thence to Cox Creek; thence to Huisache Cove which is a part of Cox Bay in Segment No. 2454; via Outfall 011 to an unnamed ditch, thence to Cox Bay in Segment No. 2454; and via Outfall 013 directly to Cox Bay in Segment No. 2454 of the Bays and Estuaries. The unclassified receiving water uses are minimal aquatic life use for the unnamed ditches and high aquatic life use for Cox Lake and Cox Creek (tidal). The designated uses for Segment Nos. 2453 and 2454 are primary contact recreation, exceptional aquatic life use, and oyster waters.

In accordance with Title 30 Texas Administrative Code Section 307.5 and TCEQ's *Procedures to Implement the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards* (June 2010), an antidegradation review of the receiving waters was performed. A Tier 1 antidegradation review has preliminarily determined that existing water quality uses will not be impaired by this

permit action. Numerical and narrative criteria to protect existing uses will be maintained. A Tier 2 review has preliminarily determined that no significant degradation of water quality is expected in Cox Lake, which has been identified as having a high aquatic life use, as well as Lavaca Bay / Chocolate Bay and Cox Bay, which have been identified as having exceptional aquatic life uses, respectively. Existing uses will be maintained and protected. The preliminary determination can be re-examined and may be modified if new information is received.

The TCEQ Executive Director reviewed this action for consistency with the Texas Coastal Management Program (CMP) goals and policies in accordance with the regulations of the General Land Office and has determined that the action is consistent with the applicable CMP goals and policies.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at **Port Lavaca Public Library, 200 W Mahan Street, Port Lavaca**, in Calhoun County, Texas and Jackson County Public Library, 411 North Wells Street, Room 121, Edna, in Jackson County, Texas.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. A public meeting will be held and will consist of two parts, an Informal Discussion Period and a Formal Comment Period. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act. During the Informal Discussion Period, the public will be encouraged to ask questions of the applicant and TCEQ staff concerning the permit application. The comments and questions submitted orally during the Informal Discussion Period will not be considered before a decision is reached on the permit application and no formal response will be made. Responses will be provided orally during the Informal Discussion Period. During the Formal Comment Period on the permit application, members of the public may state their formal comments orally into the official record. A written response to all timely, relevant and material, or significant comments will be prepared by the Executive Director. All formal comments will be considered before a decision is reached on the permit application. A copy of the written response will be sent to each person who submits a formal comment or who requested to be on the mailing list for this permit application and provides a mailing address. Only relevant and material issues raised during the Formal Comment Period can be considered if a contested case hearing is granted on this permit application.

TWIA filed proposed inflation adjustments to its maximum liability limits on August 6, 2026. The proposed adjustments would apply to windstorm and hail insurance policies delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2027. This filing does not affect TWIA's rates.

By statute, the proposed adjustments are subject to review and either approval, disapproval, or modification by the Texas Department of Insurance (TDI). G. Game-Pack-Ticket Number - A fourteen (14) digit number consisting of the four (4) digit game number (2759), a seven (7) digit Pack number, and a three (3) digit Ticket number. Ticket numbers start with 001 and end with 050 within each Pack. The format will be: 2759-0000001-001.

H. Pack - A Pack of the "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game contains 050 Tickets, packed in plastic shrink-wrapping and fan-folded in pages of one (1). Ticket back 001 and 050 will both be exposed.

I. Non-Winning Scratch Ticket - A Scratch Ticket which is not programmed to be a winning Scratch Ticket or a Scratch Ticket that does not meet all of the requirements of these Game Procedures, the State Lottery Act (Texas Government Code, Chapter 466), and applicable rules adopted by the Texas Lottery pursuant to the State Lottery Act and referenced in 16 TAC, Chapter 140.

J. Scratch Ticket Game, Scratch Ticket or Ticket - Texas Lottery "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game No. 2759.

2.0 Determination of Prize Winners. The determination of prize winners is subject to the general Scratch Ticket validation requirements set forth in Texas Lottery Rule 140.302, Scratch Ticket Game Rules, these Game Procedures, and the requirements set out on the back of each Scratch Ticket. A prize winner in the "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game is determined once the latex on the Scratch Ticket is scratched off to expose the Play Symbols as indicated per the game instructions from the total of three hundred thirteen (313) Play Symbols. \$250,000 50X CASHWORD PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: The player completely scratches all of the YOUR 20 LETTERS Play Symbols. The player then scratches all of the letters found in GAME 1, GAME 2 and GAME 3 that exactly match the YOUR 20 LETTERS Play Symbols. If the player has scratched at least 2 complete WORDS within a GAME, the player wins the prize found in the corresponding PRIZE LEGEND. WORDS revealed in one GAME cannot be combined with WORDS revealed in another GAME. Each GAME is played separately. Only 1 prize paid per GAME. Only letters within the same GAME that are matched with the YOUR 20 LETTERS Play Symbols can be used to form a complete WORD. In each GAME, every lettered square within an unbroken horizontal (left to right) or vertical (top to bottom) sequence must be

matched with the YOUR 20 LETTERS Play Symbols to be considered a complete WORD. Words revealed in a diagonal sequence are not considered valid WORDS. Words within WORDS are not eligible for a prize. Words that are spelled from right to left or bottom to top are not eligible for a prize. A complete WORD must contain at least 3 letters. GAME 1 and GAME 2 can win by revealing 2 to 11 complete WORDS on each GAME. GAME 3 can win by revealing 2 to 9 complete WORDS. MULTIPLIER PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: The player scratches the 2 MULTIPLIER SYMBOLS Play Symbols. If the player reveals 2 matching MULTIPLIER SYMBOLS Play Symbols, the player multiplies the total prize won in GAMES 1, 2 and 3 by that multiplier and wins that amount. For example, revealing 2 "50X" MULTIPLIER SYMBOLS Play Symbols will multiply the total prize won by 50 TIMES. No portion of the Display Printing nor any extraneous matter whatsoever shall be usable or playable as a part of the Scratch Ticket.

2.1 Scratch Ticket Validation Requirements.

A. To be a valid Scratch Ticket, all of the following requirements must be met:

1. Exactly three hundred thirteen (313) Play Symbols must appear under the Latex Overprint on the front portion of the Scratch Ticket;
2. Each of the Play Symbols must have a Play Symbol Caption underneath, unless specified, and each Play Symbol must agree with its Play Symbol Caption. Crossword and Bingo style games do not typically have Play Symbols captions;
3. Each of the Play Symbols must be present in its entirety and be fully legible;
4. Each of the Play Symbols must be printed in black ink except for dual image games;
5. The Scratch Ticket shall be intact;
6. The Serial Number and Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be present in their entirety and be fully legible;
7. The Serial Number must correspond, using the Texas Lottery's codes, to the Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket;
8. The Scratch Ticket must not have a hole punched through it, be mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstituted or tampered with in any manner;
9. The Scratch Ticket must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;
10. The Scratch Ticket must have been issued by the Texas Lottery in an authorized manner;
11. The Scratch Ticket must not have been stolen, nor appear on any list of omitted Scratch Tickets or non-activated Scratch Tickets on file at the Texas Lottery;

12. The Play Symbols, Serial Number and Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be right side up and not reversed in any manner;

13. The Scratch Ticket must be complete and not miscut, and have exactly three hundred thirteen (313) Play Symbols under the Latex Overprint on the front portion of the Scratch Ticket, exactly one Serial Number and exactly one Game-Pack-Ticket Number on the Scratch Ticket;

14. The Serial Number of an apparent winning Scratch Ticket shall correspond with the Texas Lottery's Serial Numbers for winning Scratch Tickets, and a Scratch Ticket with that Serial Number shall not have been paid previously;

15. The Scratch Ticket must not be blank or partially blank, misregistered, defective or printed or produced in error;

16. Each of the three hundred thirteen (313) Play Symbols must be exactly one of those described in Section 1.2.C of these Game Procedures;

17. Each of the three hundred thirteen (313) Play Symbols on the Scratch Ticket must be printed in the Symbol font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; the Scratch Ticket Serial Numbers must be printed in the Serial font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and the Game-Pack-Ticket Number must be printed in the Game-Pack-Ticket Number font and must correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery;

18. The Display Printing on the Scratch Ticket must be regular in every respect and correspond precisely to the artwork on file at the Texas Lottery; and

19. The Scratch Ticket must have been received by the Texas Lottery by applicable deadlines.

B. The Scratch Ticket must pass all additional validation tests provided for in these Game Procedures, the Texas Lottery's Rules governing the award of prizes of the amount to be validated, and any confidential validation and security tests of the Texas Lottery.

C. Any Scratch Ticket not passing all of the validation requirements is void and ineligible for any prize and shall not be paid. However, the Executive Director of the Texas Lottery ("Executive Director") may, solely at the Executive Director's discretion, refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket. In the event a defective Scratch Ticket is purchased, the only responsibility or liability of the Texas Lottery shall be to replace the defective Scratch Ticket with another unplayed Scratch Ticket in that Scratch Ticket Game (or a Scratch Ticket of equivalent sales price from any other current Texas Lottery Scratch Ticket Game) or refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket, solely at the Executive Director's discretion.

2.2 Programmed Game Parameters.

A. GENERAL: Consecutive Non-Winning Tickets within a Pack will not have matching patterns, in the same order, of Play Symbols.

B. GENERAL: There is no correlation between any exposed data on a Ticket and its status as a winner or non-winner.

C. CROSSWORD GAMES: Each grid from GAME 1 and GAME 2 will contain exactly the same number of letters.

D. CROSSWORD GAMES: Each grid from GAME 1 and GAME 2 will contain exactly the same number of words.

E. CROSSWORD GAMES: There will be no matching words on a Ticket.

F. CROSSWORD GAMES: All words used will be from the TX APPROVED WORDS v.2.042321, dated April 23, 2021.

G. CROSSWORD GAMES: All words will contain a minimum of three (3) letters.

H. CROSSWORD GAMES: All words will contain a maximum of nine (9) letters.

I. CROSSWORD GAMES: There will be a minimum of three (3) vowels in the YOUR 20 LETTERS play area. Vowels are considered to be A, E, I, O, U.

J. CROSSWORD GAMES: No consonant will appear more than nine (9) times, and no vowel will appear more than fourteen (14) times in GAME 1 and GAME 2.

K. CROSSWORD GAMES: No consonant will appear more than seven (7) times, and no vowel will appear more than ten (10) times in GAME 3.

L. CROSSWORD GAMES: There will be no matching Play Symbols in the YOUR 20 LETTERS play area.

M. CROSSWORD GAMES: At least fifteen (15) of the letters in the YOUR 20 LETTERS play area will open at least one (1) letter in GAME 1 (11x11), GAME 2 (11x11) and GAME 3 (7x7) crossword grids combinations.

N. CROSSWORD GAMES: The presence or absence of any letter or combination of letters in the YOUR 20 LETTERS play area will not be indicative of a winning or Non-Winning Ticket.

O. CROSSWORD GAMES: Words from the TX PROHIBITED WORDS v.2.042321, dated April 23, 2021, will not appear horizontally in the YOUR 20 LETTERS play area when read left to right or right to left.

P. CROSSWORD GAMES: On Non-Winning Tickets, there will be one (1) completed word in GAME 1 and one (1) completed word in GAME 2.

Q. CROSSWORD GAMES: There will be a random distribution of all Play Symbols on the Ticket, unless restricted by other parameters, play action or prize structure.

R. CROSSWORD GAMES: GAME 1 and GAME 2 will have no more than eleven (11) complete words per grid.

S. CROSSWORD GAMES: GAME 3 will have no more than nine (9) complete words.

T. CROSSWORD GAMES: A Ticket can only win one (1) time per GAME and a total of up to three (3) times per Ticket in accordance with the prize structure.

U. CROSSWORD GAMES: Each Ticket in a Pack will have unique GAMES.

V. MULTIPLIER: Two (2) matching MULTIPLIER SYMBOLS Play Symbols of "2X" (DBL), "3X" (TRP), "5X" (WINX5), "10X" (WINX10) or "50X" (WINX50) will only appear on winning Tickets, as dictated by the prize structure.

W. MULTIPLIER: Tickets that do not win in the "MULTIPLIER" play area will display two (2) different MULTIPLIER SYMBOLS Play Symbols.

2.3 Procedure for Claiming Prizes.

A. To claim a "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$10.00, \$20.00, \$30.00, \$50.00, \$80.00, \$100, \$200 or \$500, a claimant shall sign the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated on the Scratch Ticket and may present the winning Scratch Ticket to any Texas Lottery Retailer. The Texas Lottery Retailer shall verify the claim and, if valid, and upon presentation of proper identification,

if appropriate, make payment of the amount due the claimant and physically void the Scratch Ticket; provided that the Texas Lottery Retailer may, but is not required, to pay a \$30.00, \$50.00, \$80.00, \$100, \$200 or \$500 Scratch Ticket Game. In the event the Texas Lottery Retailer cannot verify the claim, the Texas Lottery Retailer shall provide the claimant with a claim form and instruct the claimant on how to file a claim with the Texas Lottery. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, a check shall be forwarded to the claimant in the amount due. In the event the claim is not validated, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly. A claimant may also claim any of the above prizes under the procedure described in Section 2.3.B and Section 2.3.C of these Game Procedures.

B. To claim a "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$1,000, \$10,000 or \$250,000, the claimant must sign the winning Scratch Ticket and may present it at one of the Texas Lottery's Claim Centers. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, payment will be made to the bearer of the validated winning Scratch Ticket for that prize upon presentation of proper identification. When paying a prize of \$600 or more, the Texas Lottery shall file the appropriate income reporting form with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and shall withhold federal income tax at a rate set by the IRS if required. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

C. As an alternative method of claiming a "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game prize, the claimant may submit the signed winning Scratch Ticket and a thoroughly completed claim form via mail. If a prize value is \$1,000,000 or more, the claimant must also provide proof of Social Security number or Taxpayer Identification (for U.S. Citizens or Resident Aliens). Mail all to: Texas Lottery, P.O. Box 16600, Austin, Texas 78761-6600. The Texas Lottery is not responsible for Scratch Tickets lost in the mail. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

D. Prior to payment by the Texas Lottery of any prize, the Texas Lottery shall deduct the amount of a delinquent tax or other money from the winnings of a prize winner who has been finally determined to be:

1. delinquent in the payment of a tax or other money to a state agency and that delinquency is reported to the Comptroller under Government Code §403.055;
2. in default on a loan made under Chapter 52, Education Code;
3. in default on a loan guaranteed under Chapter 57, Education Code; or
4. delinquent in child support payments in the amount determined by a court or a Title IV-D agency under Chapter 231, Family Code.

E. If a person is indebted or owes delinquent taxes to the State, other than those specified in the preceding paragraph, the winnings of a person shall be withheld until the debt or taxes are paid.

2.4 Allowance for Delay of Payment. The Texas Lottery may delay payment of the prize pending a final determination by the Executive Director, under any of the following circumstances:

A. if a dispute occurs, or it appears likely that a dispute may occur, regarding the prize;

B. if there is any question regarding the identity of the claimant;

C. if there is any question regarding the validity of the Scratch Ticket presented for payment; or

D. if the claim is subject to any deduction from the payment otherwise due, as described in Section 2.3.D of these Game Procedures. No liability for interest for any delay shall accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

2.5 Payment of Prizes to Persons Under 18. If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize under \$600 from the "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deliver to an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian a check or warrant in the amount of the prize payable to the order of the minor.

2.6 If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize of \$600 or more from the "\$250,000 50X CASHWORD" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deposit the amount of the prize in a custodial bank account, with an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian serving as custodian for the minor.

2.7 Scratch Ticket Claim Period. All Scratch Ticket prizes must be claimed within 180 days following the end of the Scratch Ticket Game or within the applicable time period for certain eligible military personnel as set forth in Texas Government Code §466.408. Any rights to a prize that is not claimed within that period, and in the manner specified in these Game Procedures and on the back of each Scratch Ticket, shall be forfeited.

2.8 Disclaimer. The number of prizes in a game is approximate based on the number of Scratch Tickets ordered. The number of actual prizes available in a game may vary based on number of Scratch Tickets manufactured, testing, distribution, sales and number of prizes claimed. A Scratch Ticket Game may continue to be sold even when all the top prizes have been claimed.

3.0 Scratch Ticket Ownership.

A. Until such time as a signature is placed upon the back portion of a Scratch Ticket in the space designated, a Scratch Ticket shall be owned by the physical possessor of said Scratch Ticket. When a signature is placed on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated, the player whose signature appears in that area shall be the owner of the Scratch Ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto. Notwithstanding any name or names submitted on a claim form, the Executive Director shall make payment to the player whose signature appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated. If more than one name appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket, the Executive Director will require that one of those players whose name appears thereon be designated by such players to receive payment.

B. The Texas Lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Scratch Tickets and shall not be required to pay on a lost or stolen Scratch Ticket.

4.0 Number and Value of Scratch Prizes. There will be approximately 22,080,000 Scratch Tickets in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2759. The approximate number and value of prizes in the game are as follows:

In purchasing a Scratch Ticket, the player agrees to comply with, and abide by, these Game Procedures for Scratch Ticket Game No. 2759, the State Lottery Act (Texas Government Code, Chapter 466), applicable rules adopted by the Texas Lottery pursuant to the State Lottery Act and referenced in 16 TAC, Chapter 140, and all final decisions of the Executive Director.

A. The name of Scratch Ticket Game No. 2779 is "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS". The play style is "match 3 of x".

1.1 Price of Scratch Ticket Game.

A. The price for Scratch Ticket Game No. 2779 shall be \$1.00 per Scratch Ticket.

1.2 Definitions in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2779.

A. Display Printing - That area of the Scratch Ticket outside of the area where the overprint and Play Symbols appear.

B. Latex Overprint - The removable scratch-off covering over the Play Symbols on the front of the Scratch Ticket.

C. Play Symbol - The printed data under the latex on the front of the Scratch Ticket that is used to determine eligibility for a prize. Each Play Symbol is printed in Symbol font in black ink in positive except for dual-image games. The possible black Play Symbols are: \$1.00, \$2.00, \$4.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$40.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$500 and STAR SYMBOL.

D. Play Symbol Caption - The printed material appearing below each Play Symbol which explains the Play Symbol. One caption appears under each Play Symbol and is printed in caption font in black ink

in positive. The Play Symbol Caption which corresponds with and verifies each Play Symbol is as follows:

E. Serial Number - A unique thirteen (13) digit number appearing under the latex scratch-off covering on the front of the Scratch Ticket. The Serial Number is for validation purposes and cannot be used to play the game. The format will be: 0000000000000.

F. Bar Code - A twenty-four (24) character interleaved two (2) of five (5) Bar Code which will include a four (4) digit game ID, the seven (7) digit Pack number, the three (3) digit Ticket number and the ten (10) digit Validation Number. The Bar Code appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket.

G. Game-Pack-Ticket Number - A fourteen (14) digit number consisting of the four (4) digit game number (2779), a seven (7) digit Pack number, and a three (3) digit Ticket number. Ticket numbers start with 001 and end with 150 within each Pack. The format will be: 2779-0000001-001.

H. Pack - A Pack of the "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS" Scratch Ticket Game contains 150 Tickets, packed in plastic shrink-wrapping and fanfolded in pages of five (5). Ticket 001 to 005 will be on the top page; Tickets 006 to 010 on the next page etc.; and Tickets 146 to 150 will be on the last page. All Packs will be tightly shrink-wrapped. There will be no breaks between the Tickets in a Pack.

I. Non-Winning Scratch Ticket - A Scratch Ticket which is not programmed to be a winning Scratch Ticket or a Scratch Ticket that does not meet all of the requirements of these Game Procedures, the State Lottery Act (Texas Government Code, Chapter 466), and applicable

However, the Executive Director of the Texas Lottery ("Executive Director") may, solely at the Executive Director's discretion, refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket. In the event a defective Scratch Ticket is purchased, the only responsibility or liability of the Texas Lottery shall be to replace the defective Scratch Ticket with another unplayed Scratch

Ticket in that Scratch Ticket Game (or a Scratch Ticket of equivalent sales price from any other current Texas Lottery Scratch Ticket Game) or refund the retail sales price of the Scratch Ticket, solely at the Executive Director's discretion.

2.2 Programmed Game Parameters.

A. Consecutive Non-Winning Tickets within a Pack will not have matching patterns, in the same order, of either Play Symbols or Prize Symbols.

B. A Ticket can win as indicated by the prize structure.

C. A Ticket can only win one (1) time.

D. A Prize Symbol will not appear more than three (3) times on a Ticket.

E. A Ticket will not contain two (2) or more sets of three (3) matching Prize Symbols.

F. Winning Tickets will contain three (3) matching Prize Symbols or two (2) matching Prize Symbols and a "STAR" (DBL) Play Symbol.

G. On winning Tickets, all non-winning Prize Symbols will be different from the winning Prize Symbols.

H. Non-Winning Tickets will never have more than two (2) matching Prize Symbols.

I. The "STAR" (DBL) Play Symbol will never appear on a Non-Winning Ticket.

J. The "STAR" (DBL) Play Symbol will never appear more than one (1) time on a Ticket.

K. The "STAR" (DBL) Play Symbol will never appear on a Ticket that wins with three (3) matching Prize Symbols.

L. The "STAR" (DBL) Play Symbol will never appear on a Ticket that has more than one (1) pair of matching Prize Symbols.

2.3 Procedure for Claiming Prizes.

A. To claim a "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$1.00, \$2.00, \$4.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$40.00, \$50.00, \$100 or \$500, a claimant shall sign the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated on the Scratch Ticket and may present the winning Scratch Ticket to any Texas Lottery Retailer. The Texas Lottery Retailer shall verify the claim and, if valid, and upon presentation of proper identification, if appropriate, make payment of the amount due the claimant and physically void the Scratch Ticket; provided that the Texas Lottery Retailer may, but is not required, to pay a \$40.00, \$50.00, \$100 or \$500 Scratch Ticket Game. In the event the Texas Lottery Retailer cannot verify the claim, the Texas Lottery Retailer shall provide the claimant with a claim form and instruct the claimant on how to file a claim with the Texas Lottery. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, a check shall be forwarded to the claimant in the amount due. In the event the claim is not validated, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly. A claimant may also claim any of the above prizes under the procedure described in Section 2.3.B and Section 2.3.C of these Game Procedures.

B. As an alternative method of claiming a "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS" Scratch Ticket Game prize, the claimant may submit the signed winning Scratch Ticket and a thoroughly completed claim form via mail. If a prize value is \$1,000,000 or more, the claimant must also provide proof of Social Security number or Taxpayer Identification (for U.S. Citizens or Resident Aliens). Mail all to: Texas Lottery, P.O. Box 16600, Austin, Texas 78761-6600. The Texas Lottery is not responsible for Scratch Tickets lost in the mail. In the event that the claim is not validated by the Texas Lottery, the claim shall be denied, and the claimant shall be notified promptly.

C. Prior to payment by the Texas Lottery of any prize, the Texas Lottery shall deduct the amount of a delinquent tax or other money from the winnings of a prize winner who has been finally determined to be:

1. delinquent in the payment of a tax or other money to a state agency and that delinquency is reported to the Comptroller under Government Code §403.055;

2. in default on a loan made under Chapter 52, Education Code;

3. in default on a loan guaranteed under Chapter 57, Education Code; or

4. delinquent in child support payments in the amount determined by a court or a Title IV-D agency under Chapter 231, Family Code.

D. If a person is indebted or owes delinquent taxes to the State, other than those specified in the preceding paragraph, the winnings of a person shall be withheld until the debt or taxes are paid.

2.4 Allowance for Delay of Payment. The Texas Lottery may delay payment of the prize pending a final determination by the Executive Director, under any of the following circumstances:

A. if a dispute occurs, or it appears likely that a dispute may occur, regarding the prize;

B. if there is any question regarding the identity of the claimant;

C. if there is any question regarding the validity of the Scratch Ticket presented for payment; or

D. if the claim is subject to any deduction from the payment otherwise due, as described in Section 2.3.D of these Game Procedures. No liability for interest for any delay shall accrue to the benefit of the claimant pending payment of the claim.

2.5 Payment of Prizes to Persons Under 18. If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize under \$600 from the "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS" Scratch Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deliver to an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian a check or warrant in the amount of the prize payable to the order of the minor.

2.6 If a person under the age of 18 years is entitled to a cash prize of \$600 or more from the "GNOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS" Scratch

Ticket Game, the Texas Lottery shall deposit the amount of the prize in a custodial bank account, with an adult member of the minor's family or the minor's guardian serving as custodian for the minor.

2.7 Scratch Ticket Claim Period. All Scratch Ticket prizes must be claimed within 180 days following the end of the Scratch Ticket Game or within the applicable time period for certain eligible military personnel as set forth in Texas Government Code §466.408. Any rights to a prize that is not claimed within that period, and in the manner specified in these Game Procedures and on the back of each Scratch Ticket, shall be forfeited.

2.8 Disclaimer. The number of prizes in a game is approximate based on the number of Scratch Tickets ordered. The number of actual prizes available in a game may vary based on number of Scratch Tickets manufactured, testing, distribution, sales and number of prizes claimed. A Scratch Ticket Game may continue to be sold even when all the top prizes have been claimed.

3.0 Scratch Ticket Ownership.

A. Until such time as a signature is placed upon the back portion of a Scratch Ticket in the space designated, a Scratch Ticket shall be owned by the physical possessor of said Scratch Ticket. When a signature is placed on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated, the player whose signature appears in that area shall be the owner of the Scratch Ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto. Notwithstanding any name or names submitted on a claim form, the Executive Director shall make payment to the player whose signature appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated. If more than one name appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket, the Executive Director will require that one of those players whose name appears thereon be designated by such players to receive payment.

B. The Texas Lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Scratch Tickets and shall not be required to pay on a lost or stolen Scratch Ticket.

4.0 Number and Value of Scratch Prizes. There will be approximately 9,000,000 Scratch Tickets in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2779. The approximate number and value of prizes in the game are as follows:

1.0 Name and Style of Scratch Ticket Game.

A. The name of Scratch Ticket Game No. 2780 is "HOLIDAY COUNTDOWN". The play style is "other".

1.1 Price of Scratch Ticket Game.

A. The price for Scratch Ticket Game No. 2780 shall be \$5.00 per Scratch Ticket.

1.2 Definitions in Scratch Ticket Game No. 2780.

A. Display Printing - That area of the Scratch Ticket outside of the area where the overprint and Play Symbols appear.

B. Latex Overprint - The removable scratch-off covering over the Play Symbols on the front of the Scratch Ticket.

C. Play Symbol - The printed data under the latex on the front of the Scratch Ticket that is used to determine eligibility for a prize. Each Play Symbol is printed in Symbol font in black ink in positive except for dual-image games. The possible black Play Symbols are: HOCKEY STICK SYMBOL, POINSETTIA SYMBOL, PENGUIN SYMBOL, COOKIE SYMBOL, LIGHT SYMBOL, BOW SYMBOL, ROCKING HORSE SYMBOL, FIREPLACE SYMBOL, TRAIN SYMBOL, BOOT SYMBOL, LOG SYMBOL, SHOVEL

SYMBOL, ELF SYMBOL, POLAR BEAR SYMBOL, NORTH POLE SYMBOL, CANDLE SYMBOL, SNOW GLOBE SYMBOL, SNOWMAN SYMBOL, SLED SYMBOL, WREATH SYMBOL, SUITCASE SYMBOL, COAT SYMBOL, IGLOO SYMBOL, PAJAMAS SYMBOL, DRUM SYMBOL, SKIS SYMBOL, LIST SYMBOL, TURKEY SYMBOL, TAG SYMBOL, PIE SYMBOL, 5X SYMBOL, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250, \$500, \$1,000 and \$100,000.

D. Play Symbol Caption - The printed material appearing below each Play Symbol which explains the Play Symbol. One caption appears under each Play Symbol and is printed in caption font in black ink in positive. The Play Symbol Caption which corresponds with and verifies each Play Symbol is as follows:

E. Serial Number - A unique thirteen (13) digit number appearing under the latex scratch-off covering on the front of the Scratch Ticket. The Serial Number is for validation purposes and cannot be used to play the game. The format will be: 0000000000000.

F. Bar Code - A twenty-four (24) character interleaved two (2) of five (5) Bar Code which will include a four (4) digit game ID, the seven (7) digit Pack number, the three (3) digit Ticket number and the ten (10) digit Validation Number. The Bar Code appears on the back of the Scratch Ticket.

G. Game-Pack-Ticket Number - A fourteen (14) digit number consisting of the four (4) digit game number (2780), a seven (7) digit Pack number, and a three (3) digit Ticket number. Ticket numbers start with 001 and end with 075 within each Pack. The format will be: 2780-0000001-001.

H. Pack - A Pack of the "HOLIDAY COUNTDOWN" Scratch Ticket Game contains 075 Tickets, packed in plastic shrink-wrapping and fan-folded in pages of one (1). Ticket 001 will be shown on the front of the Pack; the back of Ticket 075 will be revealed on the back of the Pack. All packs will be tightly shrink-wrapped. J. Scratch Ticket Game, Scratch Ticket or Ticket - Texas Lottery "HOLIDAY COUNTDOWN" Scratch Ticket Game No. 2780.

2.0 Determination of Prize Winners. The determination of prize winners is subject to the general Scratch Ticket validation requirements set forth in Texas Lottery Rule 140.302, Scratch Ticket Game Rules, these Game Procedures, and the requirements set out on the back of each Scratch Ticket. A prize winner in the "HOLIDAY COUNTDOWN" Scratch Ticket Game is determined once the latex on the Scratch Ticket is scratched off to expose seventy-five (75) Play Symbols. PLAY INSTRUCTIONS: The player completely scratches DAY 1-25 to reveal 2 Play Symbols in each DAY. 8. The Scratch Ticket must not have a hole punched through it, be mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstituted or tampered with in any manner;
9. The Scratch Ticket must not be counterfeit in whole or in part;
10. The Scratch Ticket must have been issued by the Texas Lottery in an authorized manner;
11. The Scratch Ticket must not have been stolen, nor appear on any list of omitted Scratch Tickets or non-activated Scratch Tickets on file at the Texas Lottery;

D. On winning and Non-Winning Tickets, the top cash prizes of \$1,000 and \$100,000 will each appear at least one (1) time, except on Tickets winning twenty-five (25) times.

E. On all Tickets, a Prize Symbol will not appear more than three (3) times across all DAY play areas, except as required by the prize structure to create multiple wins.

Q. Two (2) "5X" (WINX5) Play Symbols that appear in the same DAY play area will win 5 TIMES the prize for that DAY play area and will win as per the prize structure.

R. The "5X" (WINX5) Play Symbol will never appear on a Non-Winning Ticket.

S. A single "5X" (WINX5) Play Symbol will never appear on a Ticket.

2.3 Procedure for Claiming Prizes.

A. To claim a "HOLIDAY COUNTDOWN" Scratch Ticket Game prize of \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250 or \$500, a claimant shall sign the back of the Scratch Ticket in the space designated on the Scratch Ticket and may present the winning Scratch Ticket to any Texas Lottery Retailer. The Texas Lottery Retailer shall verify the claim and, if valid, and upon presentation of proper identification, if appropriate, make payment of the amount due the claimant and physically void the Scratch Ticket; provided that the Texas Lottery Retailer may, but is not required, to pay a \$25.00, \$50.00, \$100, \$250 or \$500 Scratch Ticket Game. In the event the Texas Lottery Retailer cannot verify the claim, the Texas Lottery Retailer shall provide the claimant with a claim form and instruct the claimant on how to file a claim with the Texas Lottery. If the claim is validated by the Texas Lottery, a check shall be forwarded to the claimant in the amount due. The Application: Blossom Telephone Company, Inc. filed a true-up in accordance with ordering paragraphs 2- 5 of the Corrected Notice of Approval issued in Docket No. 58216, *Application of Blossom Telephone Company, Inc. to Recover Funds from the Texas Universal Service Fund Under PURA § 56.025 and 16 TAC § 26.406 for Calendar Year 2022*. In that docket, the Commission determined that the Federal Communications Commission's actions were reasonably projected to reduce the amount that Blossom received in Federal Universal Service Fund (FUSF) revenue by \$201,596 for calendar year 2022. It was also estimated that Blossom would recover \$49,893 of the projected FUSF revenue impact from rate increases implemented for the same time period. 3.0 Certification, Registration, and Licensing

3.1 Work Authorization

To be eligible for certification, registration, or licensure or renewed certification, registration, or licensure, an applicant must be authorized to work lawfully in the United States.

3.12 Initial Applications

- (a) All certification, registration, and license applications must be submitted through the Commission's online certification, registration, and licensing system on the Commission's website. An applicant must comply with submission requirements stated on the application form. Incomplete applications will not be processed.
- (b) An applicant must provide the Commission with his or her Texas and national criminal history records by fingerprint search according to directions published on the Commission's website. The criminal history searches must be conducted after an application is submitted.

3.23 Renewal Applications

- (c) All certification, registration, and license renewal applications, including continuing education reporting, must be submitted through the Commission's online certification, registration, and licensing system on the Commission's website. A regulated person must comply with submission requirements stated on the renewal form. Incomplete applications will not be processed.
